SOWING SEEDS FOR LIFE

This year, the Chalke Valley Lent Appeal will be supporting CRESS, a charity which aims to help South Sudanese refugees in Uganda become self-sufficient. Rather than just providing food aid, CRESS intends to provide training to give refugees the skills to grow their own vegetables and to support their families. In addition to providing training, CRESS will also give them the seeds to grow their first crop of food.

This Lent there is a unique opportunity to meet Bishop Joseph Aba, head of CRESS in Uganda on 10th March.

There are many biblical references to seeds but one of the most powerful is the parable

of the mustard seed in which the Kingdom of Heaven is compared to a mustard seed. Mustard seeds are extremely tiny but they can grow into large trees. CRESS hopes that by providing training and seeds they will be able to make big changes to the lives of those involved in the project.

'The Kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches.' The Clergy Team encourage you to support this project and change the lives of refugees from South Sudan in Uganda.

THIS LENT PROJECT

is raising funds for the CRESS Agriculture programme. Money raised will provide for the start-up costs and training for 10 of our Savings Groups, enabling them to become confident, sustainable and successful farmers.

We aim to raise

£8000, £5000 for start-up costs, £1000 for trees to protect the gardens from the effects of climate change and £2000 for transport, allowing the team to supervise, support and encourage the new farmers.

ABOUT CRESS

CRESS is a small charity but is aiming to make a big difference to the lives of the South Sudanese people. It all started with the Chalke Valley Lent Project 2010. Caroline Lamb had visited Kajo Keji in 2009 and was moved by the lack of education, health provision and poor infrastructure.

On Caroline's return she started fundraising in earnest to help the people she had met. The mission focus of CRESS is *sowing seeds for life*, providing the South Sudanese with the skills, training and resources to become self-sufficient, sustainable and ethical communities.

CRESS originally worked in South Sudan but due to the civil war this became too dangerous. In 2017 CRESS followed the South Sudanese refugees into Northern Uganda where it now works in partnership with the Dioceses of Liwolo. Part of the work of CRESS is to equip the local Bishop Joseph Aba, to train clergy and share the Gospel widely in rural areas.



REFUGEE LIFE

Most of the refugee community in which CRESS works, lives under the \$2 a day mark. Many families just eat one simple innutritious meal a day of maize meaning they are hungry and poor nutrition leaves them vulnerable to illness. For those in refugee camps, the UN World Food Programme has announced it will have no choice but to make further food ration cuts for refugees which adds to their pressures as does the increase in inflation and climate change in Uganda. So we hope you will help us support them through this years' Lent Project.

With our delivery partners, the Diocese of Liwolo, we are looking to focus on training groups in organic, sustainable agriculture techniques to help them feed themselves, make an income and alleviate the effects of the more erratic and extreme weather conditions, caused by climate change, which are experienced by the refugee farmers with whom we work.
